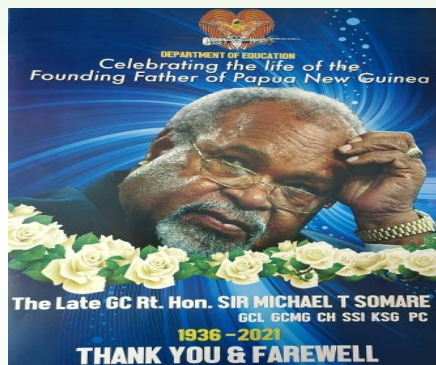


School Resumption

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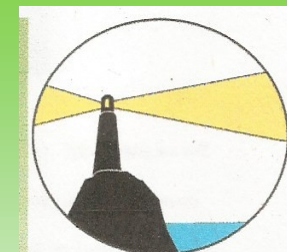
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From....the Writer's Desk.

Handover - Takeover : - Principal



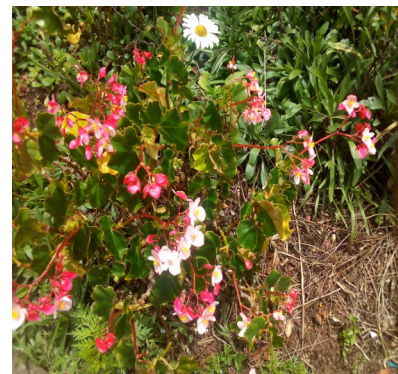

The 2021 teaching staff at HLIS is diverse. The institution has primary and high school teachers. The current principal is from neighboring Western Highlands Province while the teachers come from various parts of PNG. Although the culture is diverse the medium of communication in the school is English. In the high school section courses are offered from Grade 7-12. HLIS has hired some of the best trained and experienced teachers to teach at the school including the early childhood.

The Secondary Section has two faculties: Science and Social Science. These faculties have some of the best performing teachers the school has so far. The Gr12 performance last year was slightly dropped even though it ranked 10th in 2019.
