"The future depends on what you do today."

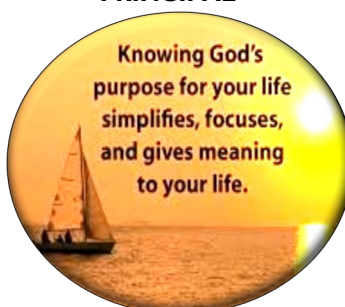

The message shared was taken from

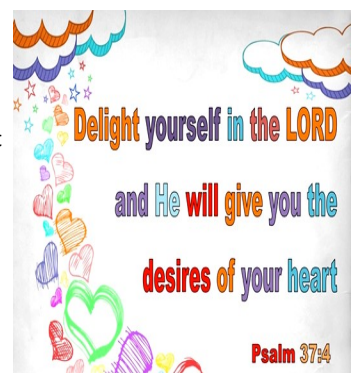
Mathew 6:1-8

Atasha Jimmy in Grade 10 & Lumeck in Grade 11 presented a brief History of Sir Michael Somare.



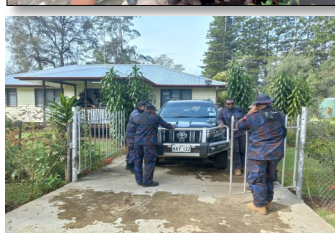
Principal Mrs. Blake made the final speech to end the special program.
